

1. Location and design, and

2. Sources of funding.

In the meantime, a request for a grant of £250,000 has been submitted to WREN (Waste Recycling Environmental Ltd.).

6. Apportionment of Recreation Ground running costs.

The contributions from the Tennis and Football Clubs have now been received for 2006-2007, and the Football Club has signed a new Agreement. The contributions for the 2007-2008 financial year will be invoiced in September.

7. Oving Football Club and Oving Villages Cup.

The Football Club finished 10th out of 14 in a very tight ADL First Division. At the Club's AGM last Friday, the Manager, Tim Walker complained about lack of commitment from some of the players, and offered his resignation. This was refused, but Philip suggested that an Assistant Manager should be appointed, and Jason offered to take on this role. Tim travels around the country during the week, and Jason will take over the training arrangements and players' availability from Monday to Friday. This was agreed by the AGM, and the Club has now registered to play in the ADL next season.

The Villages Cup was badly affected by the weather in March, and at one point, it looked as though the Final might have to be postponed. However, the semi-finals were eventually played in time for Easter, and Steeple Claydon beat Aston Park 8-1 on Easter Monday with over 200 spectators present.

8. Oving Tennis Club.

In the absence of Jack Peeters, Roger reported that some remedial drainage work has been undertaken next to the courts, which have also been cleaned. The courts will be re-surfaced in March 2008 at a cost of around £11,500. The wire netting around the courts may also have to be replaced. Membership numbers are stable, and the Men's and Ladies' teams have been doing well in their respective leagues.
